



QQI and International Cooperation: A Legislative

Requirement

Cooperate with international bodies on qualifications policy and practice

Cooperate with international bodies on quality assurance policy and practice

Obliged to inform itself of practices outside the state in respect of matters relevant to its statutory functions



International Partnerships: Quality Assurance



Links with International QA and Regulatory Bodies

QQI's key memberships include:

- European Association for Quality Assurance in Higher Education (ENQA)
- The International Network for Quality Assurance Agencies in Higher Education (INQAAHE)
- The Cross-Border Quality Assurance Network (CBQAN)

Also QQI is

- a registered agency in the European Quality Assurance Register (EQAR) and
- the Irish National Reference Point for EQAVET, a community of practice promoting European collaboration in developing and improving QA in vocational education and training




Qualifications' Frameworks and the Recognition of Qualifications



QQI as a Qualifications Authority

- QQI is the national qualifications authority as well as being the national quality assurance agency
- In terms of qualifications, QQI has the roles of:
 - maintaining Ireland's National Framework of Qualifications (NFQ)
 - facilitating the recognition of international awards in Ireland and the recognition of Irish awards internationally
- Like its engagements on quality assurance, these too have a very pronounced international dimension

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Rough guide to Ukrainian qualifications in the context of the Irish National Framework of Qualifications (Version 4.1)






A renewed focus on the international dimension of education: new Development Directorate established in QQI



The IEM at a glance...

Public confidence

The IEM will represent and promote public confidence in quality of Irish providers delivering programmes to international students

Academic provision

Covering quality of academic provision and student supports, capacity to implement robust QA and deliver coherent programmes

Enhanced quality assurance

Grounded on existing national quality assurance infrastructure, including ESG QA guidelines, enhanced by new statutory codes of practice for providers

Learner protection

Underpinned by due diligence requirements for private providers, and a statutory learner protection fund to protect international students
