

ANALYSIS OF AWARDS MADE BY QQI IN 2023



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About this report

This is a summary analysis of QQI certification data for 2023. It encompasses QQI awards made in respect of programmes delivered by further education and training (FET) providers and higher education (HE) providers.

It has three sections:

Section 1 on page 3 provides a summary with highlights.

Section 2 on page 4 provides a statistical overview and trends.

Section 3 from page 5 - 20 provides a detailed breakdown looking at NFQ level, award class, field of learning, and provider type. The analysis includes trends and information on apprenticeships, the profile of learners achieving QQI awards, and comparative analysis of awards relating to provision by the education and training boards (ETBs). The analysis suggests that the overall number of awards made by QQI in 2023 continued to recover from the impact of COVID-19 restrictions.

Disclaimers on the numbers in this report

QQI is the only body currently awarding FET qualifications that are included in the National Framework of Qualifications (NFQ). QQI awards, however, account for a relatively small fraction of the HE awards made each year that are included in the NFQ.

In many cases, data trends are outlined since 2014. This was the year when the migration of relevant FET awards to the Common Award System (CAS) was completed. The majority of QQI awards are currently part of this system.

The analysis of QQI minor awards for a given year does not include some of the components that were achieved in that year to qualify for the linked major award earned in that year. QQI is currently reviewing this approach so that the reporting of minor awards is clearer.

Data on QQI awards made at NFQ level 10 was excluded from the analysis as the numbers are too small to analyse.

Small values are not displayed to minimise the potential for statistical disclosure. Where percentages are used, these are rounded to the nearest whole number. In tables/graphs using percentages, a value of 0% indicates a small value; a blank entry indicates zero.

Summary of report with highlights

- The number of learners attaining FET and HE awards from QQI increased in 2023 for a fourth consecutive year since 2020. The increase is particularly significant in FET which increased by 15% from 2022, the largest increase since 2014.
- This increase reduced the general downward trend observed in the number of FET learners receiving QQI awards and increased the rate of growth in the number of HE learners receiving QQI awards.
- It suggests further recovery from the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic which was significant across 2020 and 2021. See further details in the annual analysis of 2021 data

These are some of the highlights:

Rise and fall of awards

- The number of **QQI FET major awards** increased in 2023 from 2022 at all levels of the NFQ. The increase is more noticeable at the lower levels of the NFQ (levels 1 to 3) and at level 6. The increase is partly explained by a rise in awards made to apprentices.
- The number of **QQI HE major awards** made in 2023 declined at NFQ levels 7 and 8 from 2022. A downward trend has been observed at NFQ level 7 since 2019.
- Craft apprenticeship certification was significantly impacted by COVID-19 but certification volumes have recovered in the years since 2021. In 2023, certification of these awards increased 56% from 2021 and 28% from 2022.
- In relation to non-major awards:
- o there was a notable increase in the volume of special purpose awards made in the FET sector up 30% from 2021 and 44% from 2022. The increase in 2023 was partly explained by a significant number of awards made in two newly certified awards: 'Door Security Practices' and 'Security Guarding'.
- $_{\odot}$ In HE, certification of special purpose awards in 2023 increased by 4% from 2022 (22% from 2021). Minor awards decreased by 2% in 2023 from 2022, following a 22% increase in 2022 from the previous year.

Shifts in providers

• The proportion of active providers who issued QQI awards to 100 learners or more per year has grown since 2014. In 2014, the proportion was 29% while in 2023 it was 52%.

Learner profile

- In total, there were more female learners than male learners attaining QQI awards. In FET, for the first time since 2019, the gender gap closed (being 50% for each). It widened in HE, where the share of female learners has been growing by average 2 percentage points per anum.
- The age distribution of learners attaining QQI awards is more distributed for FET than for HE. Individuals achieving HE awards tend to be younger than those attaining FET awards, particularly at levels 8 and 9, where a quarter of awards achieved in 2023 were by learners aged 20-29.







- 383 learners received both FET and HE awards in 2023 (up 24% from 2022)



NUMBER OF LEARNERS RECEIVING QQI AWARDS - TRENDS 2014-2023




The number of learners attaining QQI awards increased in 2023 from 2022.

This increase reduced the general downward trend observed in the number of learners attaining FET awards and increased the number of HE learners attaining QQI awards since 2014.

The **COVID-19 pandemic** and related restrictions in 2020 affected the number of QQI learners and awards achieved.

The numbers of QQI FET learners and awards have declined year on year since 2015 to 2021 by an average of 2% and 3% respectively. In 2022 and 2023, numbers increased from the previous year. The increases are particularly significant in 2023 at 15% and 13% respectively, the largest % change increase across the nine year period of this analysis.


HE learners attaining QQI awards has been growing since 2016. Year on year, the average increase in the number of HE learners and awards is 6%. This upward trend peaked in 2019. In 2023 the rate of increase lowered from 2022 to 4% and 3% respectively, which were below the respective average changes of 6%.




PROVIDERS: NUMBER OF QQI AWARDS MADE & LEARNERS - TRENDS 2014 - 2023




In 2023, there were **192 QQI active providers***. Since 2014, the total number of active providers issuing QQI awards has been decreasing, but the remaining providers are becoming larger. In 2023, more than half (**52% of QQI active providers**) issued QQI awards to 100 or more learners; in 2014 the proportion was 29%.





*The average line represents the trend calculated by averaging % differences values from the previous year.

The majority of active providers issuing QQI awards operate in the FET sector only (84% or 161 providers); 23 in the HE sector only (12%); and 8 providers operate in both the FET and HE sectors in 2023.



NUMBERS OF QQI AWARDS BY NFQ LEVEL & AWARD CLASS IN 2023




89,814 or 46% of all awards made by QQI in 2023 were at **NFQ level 5** (up 6% from 2022 when 84,582 awards were made at this level). **16,733** or 43% of **major awards** made by QQI in 2023 were at NFQ level 5 (up 8% from 2022 when 15,570 major awards were made at this level).





127,613 or 66% of all awards made by QQI in 2023 were minor awards* (up 8% from 2022 when 118,665 minor awards were made).

NUMBER OF QQI AWARDS BY SECTOR (FET/HE), NFQ LEVEL AND AWARD CLASS



29,028 FET major awards were made by QQI in 2023 (up 15% from 2022), mostly at NFQ level 5 (up 8% from 2022).

9,968 HE major awards were made by QQI in 2023 (up 4% from 2022), mostly at NFQ levels 8 (down 8% from 2022) and 9 (up 17% from 2022).

In 2023, the total number of **QQI** awards made increased in **FET** and **HE** for the fourth consecutive year. In **FET**, the number of awards increased for all classes of award. The increase is particularly noticeable for special purpose awards, which in 2023, represented three quarters of all awards made in the sector (the increase is partly explained by the significant number of awards made in two newly certified special purpose awards at level 4, 'Door Security Practices' and 'Security Guarding' in 2023. See further information on page 12).

In HE, the number of QQI awards made increased for all classes of award in 2023, except for minor awards, down 2% from 2022.



MAJOR AWARDS

The number of **QQI FET major awards increased in 2023 from 2022 at all levels of the NFQ**. The increase was more noticeable at the lower levels of the NFQ (levels 1 to 3). At these levels, numbers have grown for four consecutive years. The number of awards made also grew significantly at level 6 in FET, continuing the upward trend observed since 2019 (the increase was partly explained by the rise of apprenticeship awards - see pages 17 & 18 for further information). The number of **QQI HE major awards** made in 2023 declined at levels 7 and 8 from 2022. A downward trend is observed at level 7 since 2019.



NUMBER OF MAJOR AWARDS BY FIELD OF LEARNING (ISCED) & SECTOR IN 2023



8,484 or 29% of all **FET major awards made by QQI in 2023** were in the 'Health & welfare' field of learning*; followed by 'Engineering, manufacturing & construction' and 'Agriculture, forestry, fisheries & veterinary'. The 'Generic programmes & qualifications' field of learning experienced the highest percentage increase of QQI FET major awards made, up 40% from 2022. Only the 'Agriculture, forestry, fisheries & veterinary' field of learning decreased in 2023 from 2022 by 2%.

4,484 or 45% of all **HE awards made by QQI in 2023** were in the 'Business, administration & law' field of learning, followed by 'ICTs' and 'Education'. The ISCED fields of learning that experienced the largest increases in QQI certification from 2022 were 'Education' and 'Social sciences, journalism & information'; and decreased the most in 'Engineering, manufacturing & construction', 'Services' and 'Health & welfare'.



^{*}A large number of awards for 'childcare and youth services' (e.g. Early Learning and Care-related awards) are classified under the 'Healthcare and welfare' rather than the 'Education' field of learning (see ISCED classification).

Field of Learning by NFQ Level

FET sector: in all but one field of learning, the majority of QQI awards made (counting all award classes) were at NFQ level 5. The exception is the 'Education' field (where the majority of awards made were at level 6) and the 'ICTs' field (where the majority where made at level 3).

HE sector: the largest number of QQI HE awards were made in the 'Business, administration & law' field at NFQ level 8, followed by the 'ICTs' field at level 9.

Fields of Learning by Class of Award

In the <u>FET sector</u>, QQI made more minor awards than major or special purpose awards, except in the 'Education', 'Engineering, manufacturing & construction' and 'Services' fields, where more special purpose awards were made.

In the <u>HE sector QQI</u> made more major than minor or special purpose awards, except in the 'Engineering, manufacturing & construction' field where more special purpose awards were made and in the 'Service' field where more minor awards were made than major awards.

TRENDS TOP 15 QQI AWARDS

The **Top 15 minor, major and special purpose** awards represent 38% of all awards made by QQI in 2023.

All major awards in the Top 15 are FET awards, except for the QQI award 'Professional Master of Education in Primary Education' (introduced in 2016 as the relevant postgraduate qualification for those seeking to work in the primary school sector) and 'Master of Business Administration', which are made in HE.

The special purpose awards 'Door Security Practices' and 'Security Guarding' at level 4, were first certified in 2023 (introduced as mandatory courses for those wishing to become a Private Security Authority and/or licenced Security Officer/Door Security Person, which explains the large volume of awards certified in 2023).

37,321 or 30% of all **QQI minor awards** made in 2023 were in the top 15 awards, mainly at NFQ level 5. All 15 were made in FET.

103,879 QQI FET awards were made for the 16 Education and Training Boards (ETBs) in 2023 (up 13% from 2022). These represent 53% of all FET awards made in 2023.

60,178 QQI awards were made for the second largest group, private providers (PRC). This is an increase of 21% from 2022, mostly in FET.

DISTRIBUTION OF QQI AWARDS MADE BY PROVIDER TYPE & NFQ LEVEL

The **ETBs** accounted for the largest number of QQI awards made at NFQ levels 1-5: on average, three quarters of all awards made by QQI at levels 1-3 were for ETBs, and 67% of awards made by QQI at levels 4 and 5 were made for ETBs.

In HE, QQI awards made for **PRCs** were larger than for any other provider type at levels 6 to 9 inclusive.



QQI AWARDS MADE FOR THE EDUCATION & TRAINING BOARDS (ETBs) IN 2023



13,966 QQI awards were made for City of Dublin ETB (up 9% from 2022); followed by Cork ETB (11,143 awards, up 11%) and Dublin & Dún Laoghaire ETB (10,013 up 4%). One in three of all awards made for the ETBs were accounted for by these three ETBs.

The majority of awards made for the ETBs are minor awards (on average 80% of all awards), followed by major awards (on average 19%).




NUMBER OF QQI AWARDS MADE FOR ETBS 2019 - 2023 AND % CHANGE 2022-2023

The number of awards made between 2022 and 2023 increased in all ETBs except in Kildare & Wicklow ETB (down 7% from 2022) and increased the most in Longford & Westmeath ETB (up 49% from 2022).

On average, in 2023, 64% of all awards made by the ETBs were in the 'Business, administration & law', 'Generic programmes & qualifications' and 'Health & welfare' fields of learning.

On average, in 2023, 50% of all awards made by the ETBs were at NFQ level 5. Higher than average proportions of awards at levels 1 and 2 were made in Donegal ETB. Similarly, higher than average proportions of awards at levels 3 and 4 were made in Kildare & Wilcklow ETB and Longford & Westmeath ETB; and at levels 5 and 6 were made in Limerick & Clare ETB and Mayo, Sligo & Leitrim ETB.


QQI MAJOR AWARDS TO APPRENTICES - COMPARATIVE ANALYSIS 2019 - 2023



4,071 QQI major awards to apprentices were made in 2023 (up 28% from 2022), They were mostly made in the FET sector, 99% at NFQ level 6, 1% at level 8. SOLAS is the relevant provider for **craft apprenticeships** and issued 89% of all awards to apprentices. A number of new apprenticeships have been validated by QQI since 2019.

QQI apprenticeship awards were made in four fields of learning, the majority in the 'Engineering, manufacturing & construction' field. However, the number of apprenticeships is growing and it is expected that these awards will expand into new fields in the future.




PROFILE

93% of apprentices who achieved QQI major awards in 2023 were male. The **gender gap** widened in 2022 and 2023 from 2021 when 85% of apprentices were male. 79% of apprentices who achieved QQI major awards in 2022 were between **20-29 years of age**.



TRENDS

4,071 QQI major awards to apprentices were made in 2023, up 28% from 2022. The reduction in 2021 from 2020 was for SOLAS craft apprenticeships, which were significantly impacted by COVID-19 related restrictions.




QQI MAJOR AWARDS TO APPRENTICES - GEOGRAPHICAL LOCATION 2023



31% of all QQI major awards to apprentices were made by providers based in Dublin, 10% in Cork and 9% in Waterford*.

There are four QQI provider types involved in the delivery of apprenticeships - EMP, ETB, PRC and SOL. The **share of major awards** made to apprentices grew 3 percentage points for SOLAS and 1 percentage point for PRC and declined for ETBs and EMP between 2022 and 2023.




NUMBER OF LEARNERS RECEIVING A QQI AWARD BY GENDER & AGE IN 2023




65,040 learners achieving QQI awards in 2023 were **female** (51%, down 1 percentage point from 2022). 106,233 awards were achieved by these female learners (55% of all awards made).





The gender distribution is more balanced in FET than in HE.




At all NFQ levels, the **proportion of QQI awards** made in 2023 was higher for female than for male learners, except at level 4.

TRENDS 2019 - 2023

The share of female learners attaining FET QQI awards decreased in 2022 and 2023, narrowing the gender gap which grew by 2 percentage points between 2019-2021. However, in HE the gender gap widened substantially in 2022 and 2023, with 60% of female learners attaining HE QQI awards.




DISTRIBUTION OF LEARNERS RECEIVING A QQI AWARD BY AGE IN 2023



Overall, **learners in the 20-29 age band** attained a greater number of QQI awards in 2023 than learners in any other band. For FET awards, the peak was the 20-24 age band; for HE awards the peak was in the 25-29 age band.



In FET, male learners are younger than female learners; but in HE, the opposite is the case. This is consistent with previous years.



The **age distribution of learners attaining QQI awards** is more widely distributed for FET than for HE. Learners achieving HE awards are younger than learners attaining FET awards, particularly at NFQ levels 8 and 9, where approximately a quarter of awards achieved were by learners aged 20-29. The same findings were observed in previous years.
